#### **Dear Parents**

# My baby won't stop crying!!!

Most common reasons:

- hunger
- a dirty or wet nappy
- tiredness
- wanting a cuddle
- wind
- being too hot or too cold
- boredom
- overstimulation

You can talk to a friend, your health visitor or GP, or contact the Cry-sis helpline on 08451 228 669, open 9am to 10pm, 7 days a week. You will be charged for your call.

When to call your GP?

- has much drier nappies than usual
- has a high temperature, but their hands and feet feel cold
- has a fit (seizure or convulsion)
- has blue, mottled, ashen (grey) or very pale skin
- breathes rapidly or makes a throaty noise while breathing, or seems to be working hard to breathe, perhaps sucking in their stomach under their ribcage
- has a spotty purple-red rash anywhere on the body this could be a sign of <u>meningitis</u>

# NHS IMMUNISATION SCHEDULE FOR UNDER 2's

#### 8 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines to protect against six separate diseases: diphtheria; tetanus; whooping cough (pertussis); polio; Haemophilus influenzae type b, known as Hib, a bacterial infection that can cause severe pneumonia or meningitis in young children; and hepatitis B

Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine Rotavirus vaccine MenB vaccine

#### 12 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, second dose Rotavirus vaccine, second dose

#### 16 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, third dose Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine, second dose MenB vaccine second dose

#### 1 year

Hib/MenC vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines against meningitis C (first dose) and Hib (fourth dose)

Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, given as a single jab

Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine, third dose MenB vaccine, third dose

# 2 to 8 years (including children in reception class and school years 1 to 4)

### 3 years and 4 months


Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, second dose

4-in-1 pre-school booster, given as a single jab containing vaccines against: diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough (pertussis) and polio

be... Book



How are parents benefitted from last week's challenge?

It is reassuring to know that the nursery has clear procedures in place for intimate care and whistle blowing. It is a very sensitive area and it is good to know that whenever possible, the key worker is responsible for this.

The policy ensures the safety and welfare of the children as well as supporting the staff at the nursery. It is extremely important for the children to develop consistent and caring relationships with their key person and it ensures they feel safe and secure when separated from their primary care givers. It is also reassuring to know that hygiene is paramount in regard to nappy changing and potty use.

It is reassuring that intimate care routines are in place, ensuring the safeguarding of the children and dealing with all the possible hygiene concerns! As a parent that is about to embark on toilet training it is also good to know that Nursery will be supporting us - so we aren't giving mixed messages to the little man.

This policy has helped me to be clear on exactly how nappy changing procedures are managed & maintained so that my child receives the best possible care throughout her time at nursery. It also makes me confident that I know my daughter is receiving trained and supported care if she needs to be changed or have first aid administered.

### Answers to last week questions:

### On whose preference is the nappy changing and toilet training procedures followed?

Babies and toddlers will have their nappies changed according to their individual needs and requirements by their key worker wherever possible. Information will be shared between parents and key workers about nappy changing and toilet training in a way that suits the parents

## What is the maximum duration between nappy changes?

Nappies will never be left longer than three hours

#### **SUN CARE POLICY**

Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery is committed to ensuring that all children are fully protected from the dangers of too much sun. Severe sunburn in childhood can lead to the development of malignant melanoma (the most dangerous type of skin cancer) in later life.

We use the following procedures to keep children safe and healthy in the sun:

- Children must have a clearly named sun hat which will be worn at all times whilst outside
  in sunny weather. This hat will preferably be of legionaries design (i.e. with an extended
  back and side to shield children's neck and ears from sun) to provide additional protection
- Children must have their own high factor sun cream named and dated with prior written consent for staff to apply. This enables children to have sun cream suitable for their own individual needs
- Children need light-weight cotton clothing suitable for the sun, with long sleeves and long legs if prone to sunburn
- Children's safety outside in the sun is the nursery's prime objective so staff will work closely
  with parents to ensure all appropriate cream and clothing is provided
- Children will not be out in the sun between 11.00am 3.00pm on hot days
- Children will always have sun cream applied before going outside in the sun and at frequent intervals during the day
- Children are offered cooled water more frequently throughout sunny or warm days
- Children are made aware of the need for sun hats, sun cream and the need to drink more fluids during their time in the sun
- Staff will make day-to-day decisions about the length of time spent outside dependant on the strength of the sun
- Shade will be provided to ensure children are able to cool down or escape the sun should they wish or need to
